On Saturday, September 20th, 2008, from 12:00 pm to 4:00 pm MOSA will hold a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day in the Schoharie County area at the MOSA Schoharie Transfer Station located at 2805 Route 7 in Howes Cave, NY.

Every home has hazardous products that need to be disposed of safely. These items can be hazardous to the environment, animals and our families when they are stockpiled, abandoned or disposed of improperly.

**HOUSEHOLDS:** To regulate traffic flow, drop-off times are scheduled in 15-minute increments, alphabetically by **LAST** name.

**Typical Household Hazardous Waste Includes:**

House and garden pesticides, corrosives, cleaning products, solvents, pool chemicals, paints and stains, adhesives, dry cell batteries, photography and hobby chemicals, aerosols and products containing mercury.  
Microwaves and small kitchen appliances will also be accepted as scrap metal at no charge.

**Electronic Collection Includes:**

**No CHARGE** – computer hard drives, printers, laptops, keyboards, typewriters, wire & cables, medical electronics, telephone equipment, and other miscellaneous electronics (i.e. VCR's, radios, DVD & CD players)

**PER UNIT CHARGE**-Computer Monitors/Computer Terminals, cathode ray tubes (CRT)-  
\$2.50 - Up to 17"  
\$4.00 - Larger than 17"

**PER UNIT CHARGE**-TV SETS  
\$5.00 - Television sets up to 19"  
\$12.50 - Television sets larger than 19" and consoles  
\$12.50 - Photocopiers/Stand alone printers w/ bulk toner

Fluorescent Lights will be accepted with the following amounts **charged (\$ .05 per foot) or:**

- 4 foot bulb - \$ .20
- 8 foot bulb - \$ .40

**Items not accepted Include:**

Ammunition and explosives, tires, smoke detectors, motor-oil, lead batteries, medication and infectious waste, asbestos, construction and demolition debris, and unsorted waste or non-hazardous recyclable materials ("regular trash").

**EVENTS OPEN TO ALL RESIDENTS IN THE TRI-COUNTY SERVICE AREA**

Residents are asked to provide Picture ID as Proof of Residency

# Did You Know?



## Used Motor Oil

The improper disposal of used motor oil can contaminate lakes, rivers, and groundwater. The used oil from a single oil change can literally contaminate a million gallons of fresh water.

Oil should never be dumped on the ground, put in the trash, or poured in the sewer or down the drain. Your best disposal option is to recycle used oil.

## Used Oil Filters

Used oil filters need to be handled with care. A used oil filter from a passenger car can contain a pint to a quart of oil. And even if a filter is drained overnight, it will still contain 2 to 8 ounces of used oil.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency requires used oil filters to be drained before they are discarded or recycled, in the interest of protecting the environment and your local community.

**You can make a difference by recycling your used motor oil.**

## It's The Law

In New York State, service stations that annually sell 500 gallons of oil and retailers that sell 1000 gallons of oil **MUST** accept up to 5 gallons of used oil per person per day – **at No Charge to You!**



New York State Law also requires auto battery retailers and distributors to accept, free of charge, up to 2 used batteries per month from any individual. Some local scrap dealers will purchase used batteries as well.
